Fun Bible Facts

Jordan River

The Jordan River is mentioned frequently in The Bible, about 180 times in the Old Testament and about 15 times in the New Testament.

From the Sea of Galilee to the Dead Sea, in a straight line the Jordan River is about 65 miles long.

From its beginning in the north to its terminus at the Dead Sea, the elevation of the river drops tremendously - from the heights of Mount Hermon to the depths of the Dead Sea - a drop of about 2,380 feet. Due to its winding course, the river itself actually measures nearly 200 miles, over twice its direct distance.

The first historical notice of the Jordan is in the account of the separation of Abraham and Lot (Gen 13:10). "Lot beheld the plain of Jordan as the garden of the Lord."
