Fun Bible Facts

Did people in the Bible have last names?

People in Bible times did not really have last names like we think of last names today. They frequently went by something similar to "Simon, son of Jonah" (Matthew 16:17). The phrase "son of Jonah" identified Simon as a different Simon than all the other Simons by this family connection. This functioned very close to a last name.

Sometimes a person was identified by his tribe, such as "Aaron, the Levite" (Exodus 4:14), which differentiated that particular Aaron from the Aarons in other tribes. In the same way, Jesus was called Jesus of Nazareth to indicate His hometown (Matthew 26:71; John 18:5). Others in biblical times used their occupations as a functional last name, such as "Simon the tanner" (Acts 10:6). "Tanner" wasn't his last name, but a way to distinguish him from other Simons in the area who had different occupation.
