Fun Bible Facts What type of money did people use?

The Roman currency during most of the Roman Republic and the western half of the Roman Empire consisted of coins including the aureus (gold), the denarius (silver), the sestertius (bronze), the dupondius (bronze), and the as (copper). These were used from the middle of the third century BC until the middle of the third century AD.

Estimates of the value of the denarius equal the purchasing power of approximately \$15.00 at the beginning of the Roman Empire to around \$29.00 dollars by its end (comparing bread, wine and meat prices). This equaled around one to three days' pay for a Legionnaire.

The imagery on coins took an important step when Julius Caesar issued coins bearing his own portrait. While moneyers had earlier issued coins with portraits of ancestors, Caesar's was the first Roman coinage to feature the portrait of a living individual.
